## \$1M in Adams County Open Space Grants for Northglenn

Funds Going to New Park, Kiwanis Pool Improvements

The city accepted more than \$1 million in open space grants from the Adams County Board of Commissioners on May 2.

The city received \$252,000 for the purchase of 3.43 acres of land at 421 W. 112th Ave. for a new park. This land is adjacent to the Northglenn Justice Center, which is under construction at 112th Avenue and Community Center Drive.

Another grant, for \$800,000, will go toward improvements at Kiwanis Pool, 550 Garland St. The city plans to replace the bath house, add a splash pad and make other on-site improvements.


Funds for the grants come from the county's voter-approved Open Space Sales Tax.

In total, the commissioners awarded \$6,340,683.45 to 16 projects throughout the county.



### CONSTRUCTION FOR SCHOOLS

The Five Star community made a significant investment in students and schools when it passed a \$350 million bond issue in November 2016.

The bond provides funding to address needs in every school in the district, including all 12 schools in Northglenn.

The largest project in Northglenn is the major renovation to STEM Lab, a K-8 school at 11700 Irma Drive. The two-year, multi-phased construction and renovation begins June 2017.

The entire project is expected to be completed for the start of the 2018-19 school year and increase student enrollment by 200 students.

Design work is also underway for renovations at North Mor, Stukey and Westview elementary schools. The majority of this





## "Slow the Flow" With Free Check of Your Lawn Sprinkler System

Northglenn residents who have automatic sprinklers for watering turf at their homes can have a FREE inspection of their irrigation systems that could save around 5,000 gallons of water per year.

To schedule an appointment, go to www. conservationcenter.org/sprinkler or contact the Center for ReSource Conservation (CRC) at 303-999-3824. You will be contacted to set up a 1.5-hour appointment with a trained water technician.

A sprinkler inspection includes the following:

- · A visual inspection to pinpoint any problems in your sprinkler system
- Tests to measure the precipitation rate of your sprinkler system
- Tests to determine how evenly the water

### TOILET, WASHER REBATES AVAILABLE

What's that flushing sound?

Water – and money – going down the drain if you don't have a low-volume toilet or high-efficiency washing machine.

To encourage residents to upgrade their appliances, the city is offering a rebate of \$75 for toilets and \$100 for washing machines if you replace a high water use appliance with a high efficiency model. These rebates will be applied to your water bill.

### DON'T FLUSH TROUBLE!

Your toilet is not a garbage can.

Labels on products you use may say they are "flushable" but disposable wipes and other products can clog sewer lines. For the homeowner, these problems can be expensive to fix and they can also cause raw sewage overflow into buildings and waterways.

So, think trash, not toilets!



- Check hoses, valves, faucets Use a broom instead of a and sprinklers for leaks.
- Set your lawnmower one notch higher.




