## \$1M in Adams County Open Space Grants for Northglenn

### ► Funds Going to New Park, Kiwanis Pool Improvements

The city accepted more than \$1 million in open space grants from the Adams County Board of Commissioners on May 2.

The city received \$252,000 for the purchase of 3.43 acres of land at 421 W. 112th Ave. for a new park. This land is adjacent to the Northglenn Justice Center, which is under construction at 112th Avenue and Community Center Drive.

Another grant, for \$800,000, will go toward improvements at Kiwanis Pool, 550 Garland St. The city plans to replace the bath house, add a splash pad and make other on-site improvements.

Funds for the grants come from the county's voter-approved Open Space Sales Tax.

In total, the commissioners awarded \$6,340,683.45 to 16 projects throughout the county.

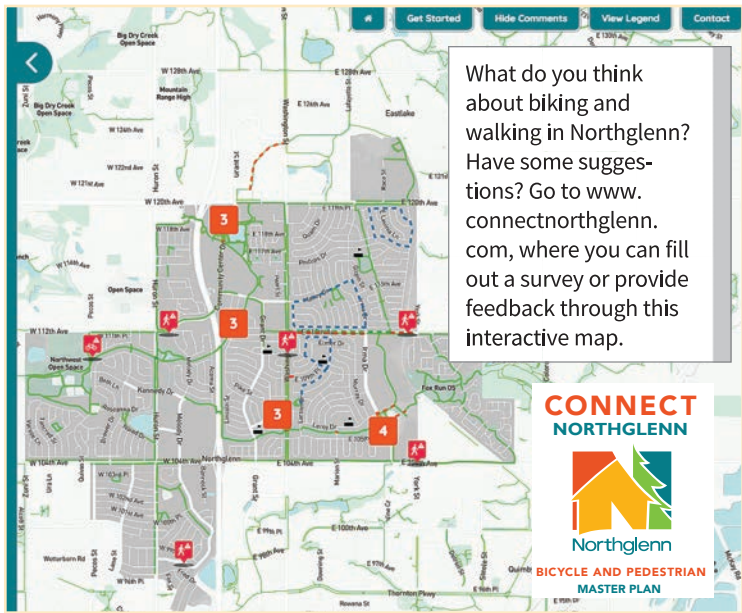

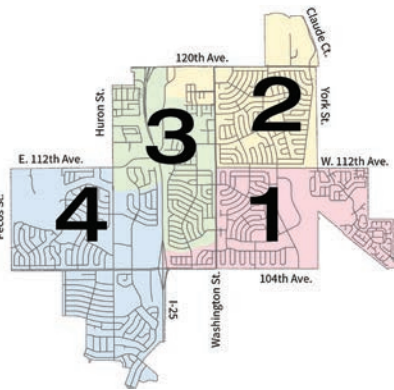

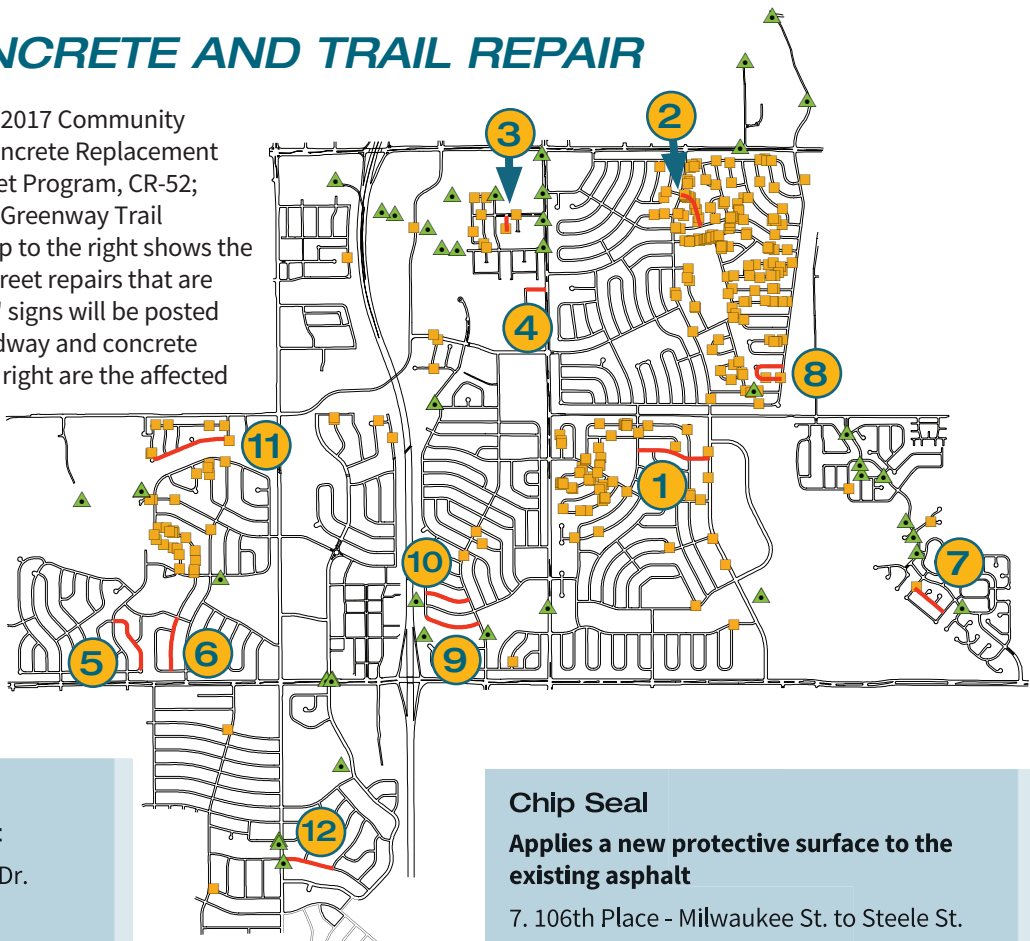
2017 ROAD, CONCRETE AND TRAIL REPAIR

On May 8, City Council approved the 2017 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Concrete Replacement Project, CR-50; 2017 Residential Street Program, CR-52; and the 2017 Concrete Program and Greenway Trail Replacement Project, CR-54. The map to the right shows the locations of the concrete, trail and street repairs that are scheduled for this year. NORTHGLENN SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT: CONSTRUCTION FOR SCHOOLS

The Five Star community made a significant investment in students and schools when it passed a \$350 million bond issue in November 2016.

The bond provides funding to address needs in every school in the district, including all 12 schools in Northglenn.

The largest project in Northglenn is the major renovation to STEM Lab, a K-8 school at 11700 Irma Drive. The two-year, multi-phased construction and renovation begins June 2017.

The entire project is expected to be completed for the start of the 2018-19 school year and increase student enrollment by 200 students.

Design work is also underway for renovations at North Mor, Stukey and Westview elementary schools. The majority of this

construction work is expected to take place in the summer of 2018.

Remaining Northglenn schools will begin their projects in the years to come. The majority of bond projects across the district will be complete within five years.

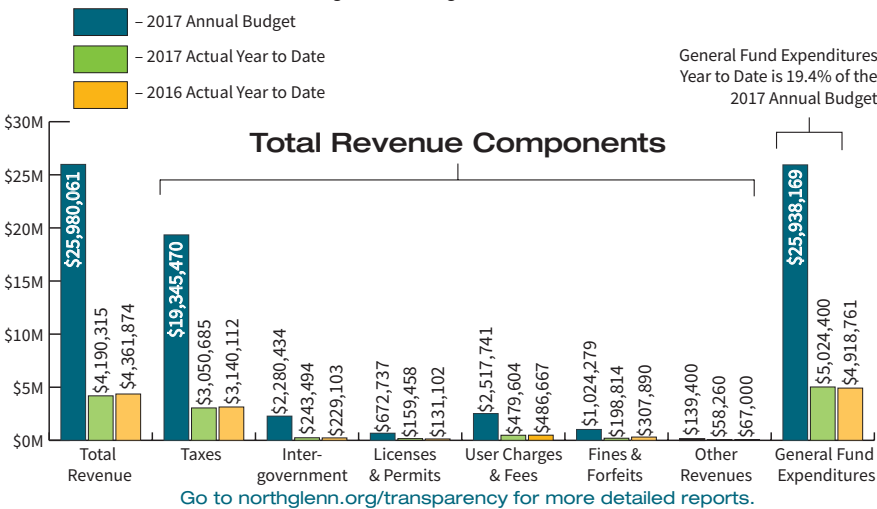

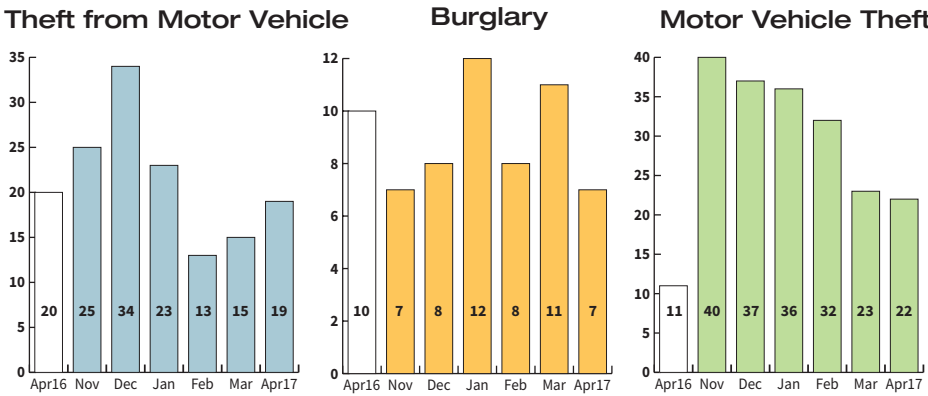

Not sure how long you should be watering your lawn? Use these guides to determine how many minutes per week each zone of grass in your lawn should be watered, based on watering two times per week. Other types of landscapes may require different amounts of water.

Northglenn residents who have automatic sprinklers for watering turf at their homes can have a FREE inspection of their irrigation systems that could save around 5,000 gallons of water per year.

To schedule an appointment, go to [www.conservationcenter.org/sprinkler](http://www.conservationcenter.org/sprinkler) or contact the Center for ReSource Conservation (CRC) at 303-999-3824. You will be contacted to set up a 1.5-hour appointment with a trained water technician.

A sprinkler inspection includes the following:

- A visual inspection to pinpoint any problems in your sprinkler system
- Tests to measure the precipitation rate of your sprinkler system
- Tests to determine how evenly the water

- is covering the intended area
- Soil sample to determine root depth and soil type

After the inspection, you will receive a

customized watering schedule and recommendations and tips to make your system more effective. Plus, get resources for improving your landscape and keeping it beautiful and healthy.

REBATES AVAILABLE

What's that flushing sound?

Water – and money – going down the drain if you don't have a low-volume toilet or high-efficiency washing machine.

To encourage residents to upgrade their appliances, the city is offering a rebate of \$75 for toilets and \$100 for washing machines if you replace a high water use appliance with a high efficiency model. These rebates will be applied to your water bill.

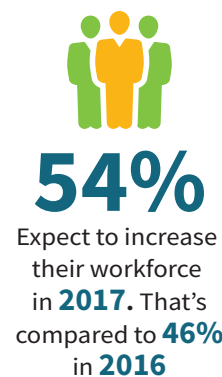
**Business retention is the foundation of a healthy local economy, and is a top priority for the city.**

To better understand the business climate of Northglenn, the Economic Development Division distributed a survey to all companies in the city. This is the city's 4th annual business survey and we had 91 responses.

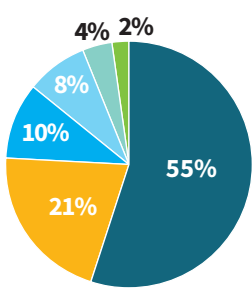
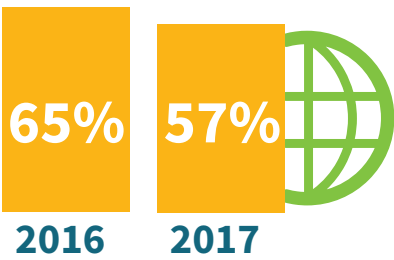
