GAMING CHARITY LIVE STREAM

The Northglenn Youth Commission (NYC) wanted to have a steady start to a year by focusing on public health. Interested in trying out a new form of fundraising, the Commission reached out to the South Suburban Parks & Recreation District to learn about their Esports Lounge. In doing so, an opportunity to work collaboratively on a livestream charity event was realized. Having volunteered with Ronald McDonald House Charity of Denver (RMHC) in the past outside of the Youth Commission, members chose to raise funds for them. RMHC helps youth in need by providing their families a place to stay while they're in the hospital, something that is perfectly aligned with NYC. After months of planning and playing a variety of games on several different consoles, a small amount was raised on June 3, 2023.

After meeting with individuals interested in speaking with them on the topic, the Commission brainstormed strategies to bolster awareness and engage youth regarding youth addiction. The Commission ultimately chose to host a poster contest for students, grades 6-12, who are residents of Northglenn or attending a school within the Adams 12 School District. The poster contest aimed to help youth start a conversation around addiction with their peers and families through visual art. A total of 18 submissions were received, and the top three contestants were selected at the end of the year.
