Grants Available to Nonprofits

The City of Northglenn is accepting applications for the 2018 Outside Agency Funding (OAF) Grant Program.

The 2018 Budget includes \$15,000 to be awarded to nonprofit organizations that directly serve Northglenn residents.

The City Council OAF Committee will review the applications and make recommendations to the full council on funding amounts.

Free Landfill Day for Northglenn Residents on May 12

Northglenn residents – this is your chance to dispose of items that are too large to fit in your trash cart for free!

Free landfill day is 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, May 12. Head to Tower Road Landfill, 8480 Tower Road in Commerce City.

Make sure you bring a driver's license or current utility bill, as proof of residency is required.

Only one load per residence, and all loads must be covered.

Everything is free to drop off, except for mattresses and box springs, which cost \$30 each.

People bringing a pickup truck or trailer face a gate charge plus taxes and fees if they have more than five cubic yards of materials

Electronics, tires, car batteries, appliances with Freon, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous liquids or materials are NOT accepted.
