Free Landfill Day

Sat., Oct. 12, 7 a.m.-2 p.m., Tower Road Landfill, 88th Avenue, just east of Tower Road, Commerce City

Northglenn residents – this is your free chance to dispose of items that are too large to fit in your trash cart! Rules include:

- Only one load per residence.
- All loads must be covered.
- Proof of residency such as a driver's license or a current utility bill with picture ID is required.
- Mattresses and box springs cost \$30 each to drop off.
- People bringing a pickup truck or trailer face a gate charge plus taxes and fees if they have more than five cubic yards of materials.
- A safety vest must be worn when unloading. They are provided at the landfill entrance.
- The following are NOT accepted: Electronics, tires, car batteries, appliances with Freon, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous liquids or materials.
