



NEW LANES

Installed the city's first permanent bike lanes on Grant Drive and shared-lane markings on Larson Lane



EVENT PARKING

Introduced additional bicycle parking at city events



BIKE TO WORK

Hosted winter and summer Bike to Work Day stations at E.B. Rains Jr. Memorial Park



COMPLETE STREETS

Council adopted a Complete Streets Policy so bicyclist and pedestrian needs are accommodated in construction and development projects



RACKS & REPAIRS

Installed a repair station at Northwest Open Space and 24 racks throughout Northglenn with the help of a LiveWell Colorado Grant



PARK GRANT

Received an Adams County Open Space grant to install a bicycle repair station and more than 20 racks throughout the city



EMPLOYEE RIDES

City employees participated in seven Friday lunch break rides that combined spanned more than 75 miles



BIKE RODEO

Nearly doubled participation in Derby Day's Bike Rodeo event and increased refurbished bike giveaway to 50 children

CONNECT NORTHGLENN

FIRST YEAR IMPLEMENTATION HIGHLIGHTS

In February 2018, City Council adopted Connect Northglenn, the city's first bicycle and pedestrian master plan.

Connect Northglenn is a framework for implementing active transportation infrastructure and programming improvements in the city.

ON TAP FOR 2019

- Adopt new Unified Development Ordinance with enhanced bicycle- and pedestrian-friendly regulations, including bike parking requirements
- Implement Adams County Open Space grant
- Leverage \$200k in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to complete projects including bike lanes and shared lane markings
- Install nearly 2.5 miles of new bicycle improvements through CDBG and city projects
- Partner with Bicycle Colorado to offer bicycle-friendly driver education courses
