

Project Title: License Plate Reader – 4CAM mobile system

Applicant: City of Northglenn, Police Department

ABSTRACT: Identifiers: criminal intelligence, license plate readers, officer safety, surveillance, equipment-general

Program Narrative: The City of Northglenn is a 7.5 mile jurisdiction in Adams County with a segment of I-25 running along the most western border. The 2018 annual average daily traffic count traveling this segment of I-25 is 157,000 vehicles, any of which may enter our city and be stolen, unregistered, associated to Amber alerts, BOLO's, wanted criminals, or drivers with outstanding traffic violations.

Because the license plate reader instantly captures and checks the license plate information against other law enforcement databases patrol officers can be immediately alerted to hits, prompting necessary actions and precautions. Additionally, LPR data can be shared across jurisdictions for proactive and preventative enforcement.

These high tech devices capture computer readable images of license plates along with location, date and time the data was captured. Thus, expanding their benefit beyond patrol operations to providing evidentiary information specific to investigations as well as prosecutions.

The Northglenn Police Department recognizes the value of the LPR technology in law enforcement and is seeking funding for the purchase of one 4CAM mobile system to be installed in one patrol/traffic vehicle.

Goals:

- Enhance enforcement, investigations, prosecutions, and data sharing of information obtained through the utilization of the license plate reader.

Objectives:

- Secure funding to purchase and install (1) 4CAM mobile system in one patrol/traffic vehicle.

Implementation:

- 2020 - Purchase 2020-2025 subscription (1) 4CAM mobile system (hardware and software rolled into package).
 - Payment of \$8512.00, at signing, includes year 1 & 5
- 2021 - Subscription payment \$4234
- Year 3 & 4 to be paid by Northglenn Police Department outside of this grant
- Upon final payment Northglenn would own the equipment. Northglenn would need to renew the subscription to continue using the hosted software.
