Starting in April, the Yard Waste Mulching Center will be open every Friday from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and every Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. through November.

Located at the Maintenance & Operations Facility, 12301 Claude Court, city residents of single-family homes can bring branches, bagged leaves and other green waste to the center. The center does NOT accept sod or dirt. Please bring proof of city residency.

Anyone, including residents and private businesses, can come by the center to pick up mulch for free.

Pedestrian Bridge at Croke Reservoir Being Replaced

The existing pedestrian bridge is settling and needs to be replaced at Croke Reservoir in Northglenn, just north of Naiad Drive and west of Huron Street.

The old bridge will be removed and replaced in the same location with a new structure. The contractor will begin the demolition and removal of the bridge the week of April 2. Work is anticipated to be complete in four to five weeks. Access to the Croke Reservoir trail at this location will be closed during this time.

Residents may access the trail from the northwest through Danahy Park or from the east near Huron Street.

The rest of the nature area will remain open to the public, including the nearby fishing pier.
