## Cats at Large



### **City Ordinance Section 14-3-8b**

*It shall be unlawful for the owner of any cat to permit or allow such cat to run at large. Whenever any cat shall be found running at large in the City, it shall be presumed until the contrary appears that such cat, is permitted by the owner to run at large.*

### **City Ordinance Section 14-2-3/14-2-4 Rabies Inoculation and Exhibition of Tag Required**

*Every dog and cat over the age of (6) months, and that has been acquired by owner and brought into the city within (30) days shall be inoculated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The current rabies tag shall be affixed to collar at all times.*

## Finding A Lost Pet

- Consider micro-chipping your pet, if your pet loses its tags, or has a difficult time keeping them on, it's another effective way for Animal Control to get your pet home.
- If you find a lost pet, please call Northglenn Animal Control or turn the animal into a shelter as soon as possible to insure its return to owner.
- If you lost a pet, contact Northglenn Animal Control as soon as possible. We may already have your pet in custody.



## Preventing your pet from straying

- The number one reason pets stray is because they are un-spayed/un-neutered. (There are many low-cost spay/neuter clinics available, check with your local animal shelter for more information.)
- Spending adequate time with your pet is essential. A happy animal is highly unlikely to stray from home. Accidents can happen though, if you have children that tend to leave gates or doors open, try self-closing hinges.
- There are alternate options for cats, such as outdoor cat enclosures. (See picture) They are designed to attach directly to your house with a small doggie door or even to an existing window. This way your cat(s) may come or go as they please.
